The Stations of the Cross*

A devotional/meditative experience of the last hours of the life of Jesus Christ, incorporating Scripture and artwork produced by artists from Emmanuel.

Monday April 14 - Thursday, April 17, 2014 9:00 am ~ 9:00 pm, daily.

Enter at Main Office Entrance

Retrace the last journey of Jesus, beginning in the Garden of Gethsemane and ending at the tomb of his burial. Revisit his suffering for the sins of humanity. Reflect on his sacrifice to rescue and repair a broken world.

* The Stations of the Cross forms part of the rich history of the devotional life of the Christian church, particularly around Holy Week. As part of their acts of devotion, early Christian pilgrims to Jerusalem retraced the route of Jesus as he carried his cross to his death. Since many people could not make the arduous pilgrimage to Jerusalem, in the medieval period there developed the practice of using depictions of these Stations in local cathedrals to allow worshippers to participate in the same devotional journey.
